You will need to check other members of your family and you need to re-treat after a number of days as the eggs, which were not killed, will have hatched – that way it will prevent them re-occurring.

## Sickness – 48 hour rule

If a child has diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms they must stay away from the school until they have been free of symptoms for 48 hours (the '48 hour rule') and feel well. If your child is sick at school, we will ask you or your emergency contact to take your child home. They should not return for 48 hours.

We appreciate that this is inconvenient in many cases, but you will appreciate that if apply this rule in all cases it should reduce the risk of infection for all children in school.

## MEDICINE

Please could we remind parents that if your child needs to have medicine in school this **needs to be bought in by a parent** and a medical form completed. At the end of the day parents should also collect medicine from the office. We cannot accept or administer medicine without parental consent
